

\*Starred Review\* This unique, comprehensive work provides the reader with a wide understanding of the many aspects of crime and punishment. The editor, a social historian at SUNY-Stony Brook, is a specialist in U.S. criminal history. The more than 700 alphabetically arranged, signed entries in the first four volumes are clearly written, accurate, and up-to-date. A "Reader's Guide" in the first volume provides an entryway to the entire work, breaking entries into thematic groups such as "Biographies"; "Courts, Corrections, Punishments"; "Historical Cities in Crime and Punishment"; "Police and Law Enforcement"; and "Socioeconomic, Political, and Religious Issues." Volume 1 contains a chronology spanning from 1275 to 2012. The entries range widely, covering specific criminals and law enforcers as well as various locations, events, cases, causes, and theories. The total work is balanced and thorough. Entries range from 2 to 10 pages and include information on cities and states, court decisions and societal events, ethnic groups, specific periods in history, public leaders, and contemporary situations, including white-collar and environmental crimes. A variety of statistics enhance understanding. There are see also notations throughout, and suggestions for further readings (with full bibliographical information) are at the end of each entry. Volume 5 contains primary documents arranged by time period, with full references for further information. An introduction to each period provides an important overview. The set concludes with a glossary; a "Resource Guide" (books, journals, and electronic resources); and an extensive index. Currency is shown in such entries as the number of police officers in one city in 2012 and books published on some of the topics in 2012. Controversial subjects from both past and present receive balanced treatment. This excellent work will be valuable for a wide range of users for assignments or general interest in public and academic libraries. --Arthur Meyers
